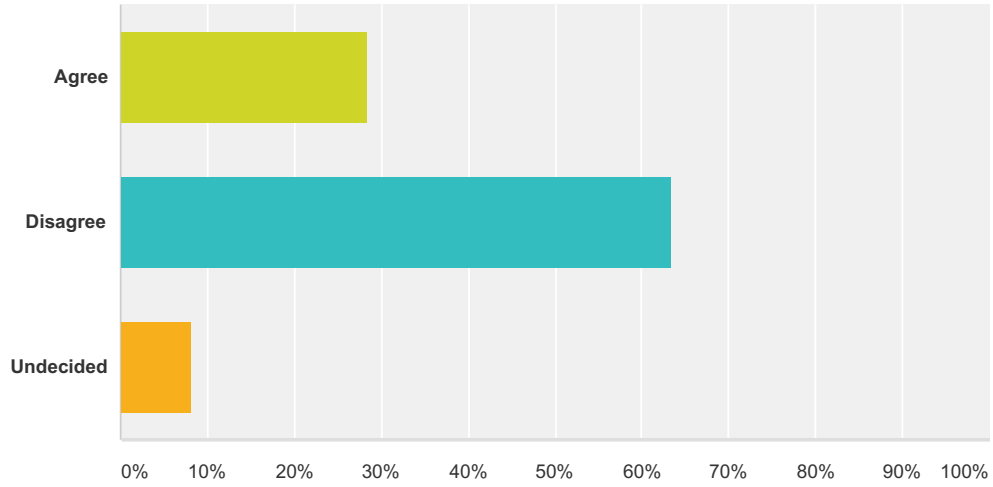

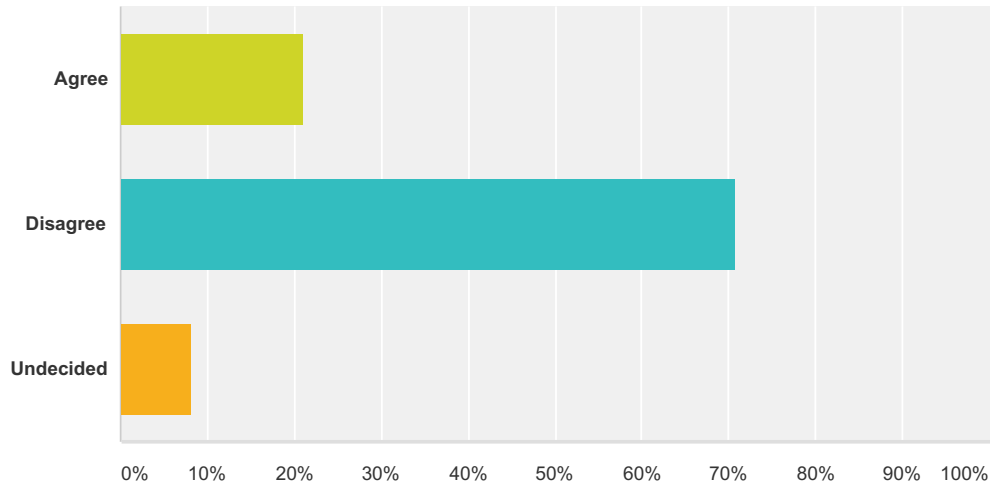

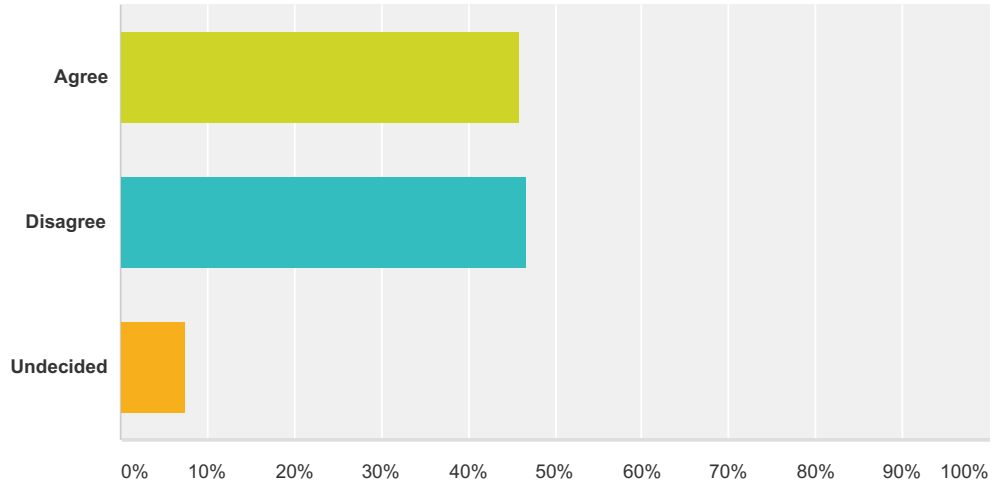

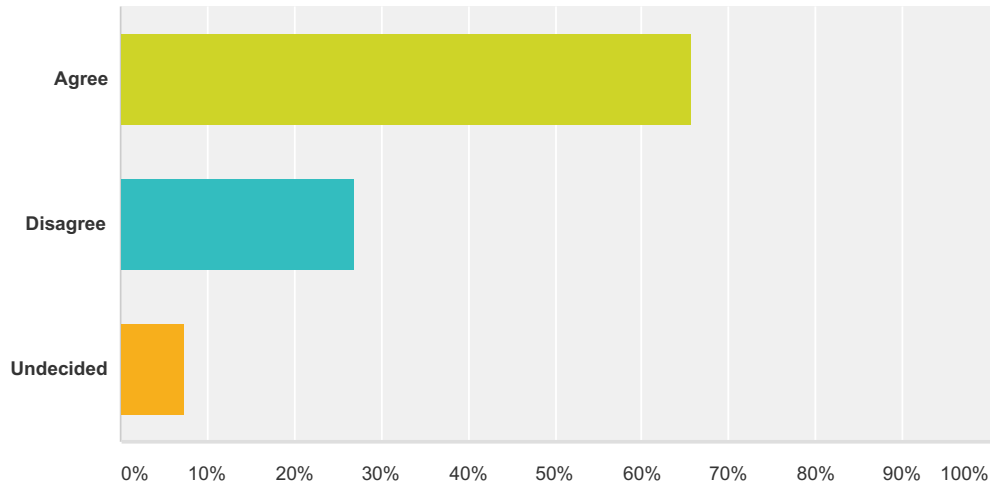

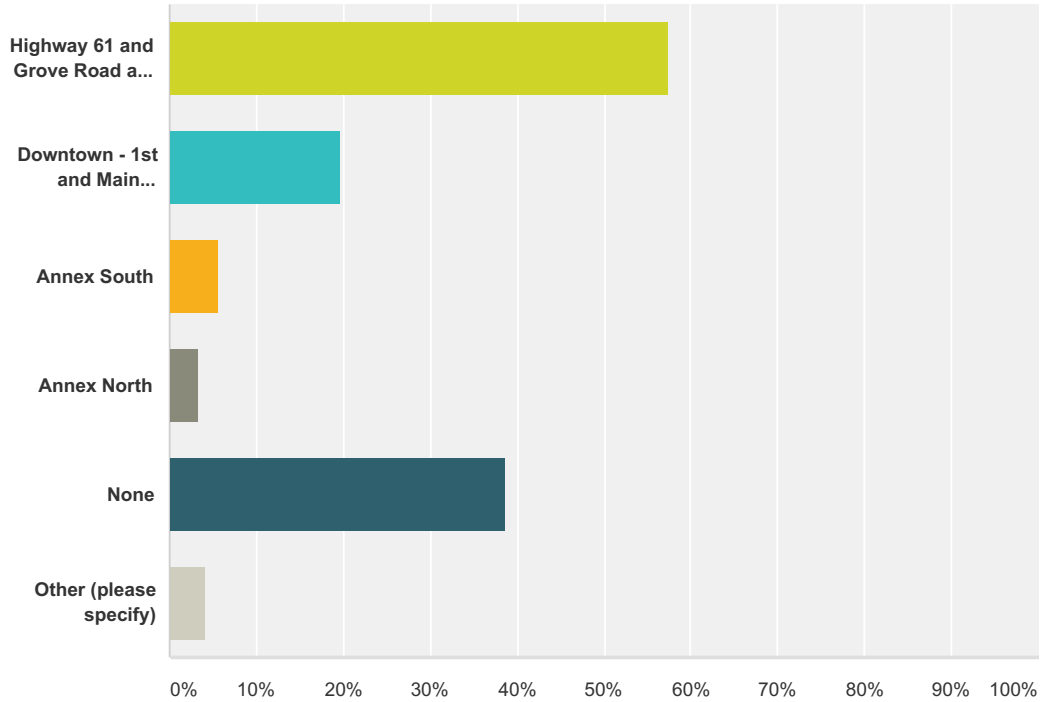

**Q6 If there were Commercial growth, what area, within the City limits or through future annexation would be your preference? Mark all that apply.**

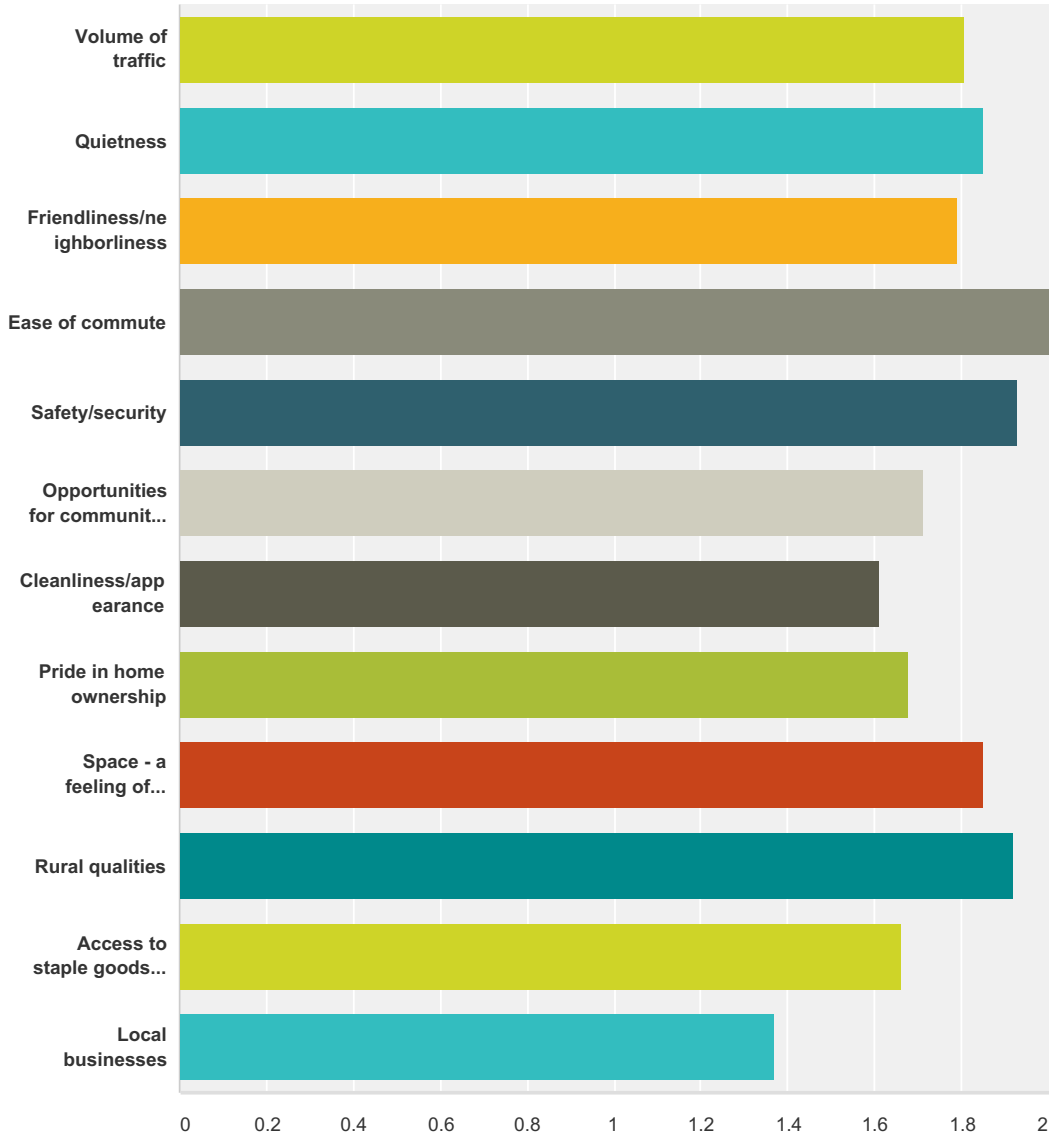

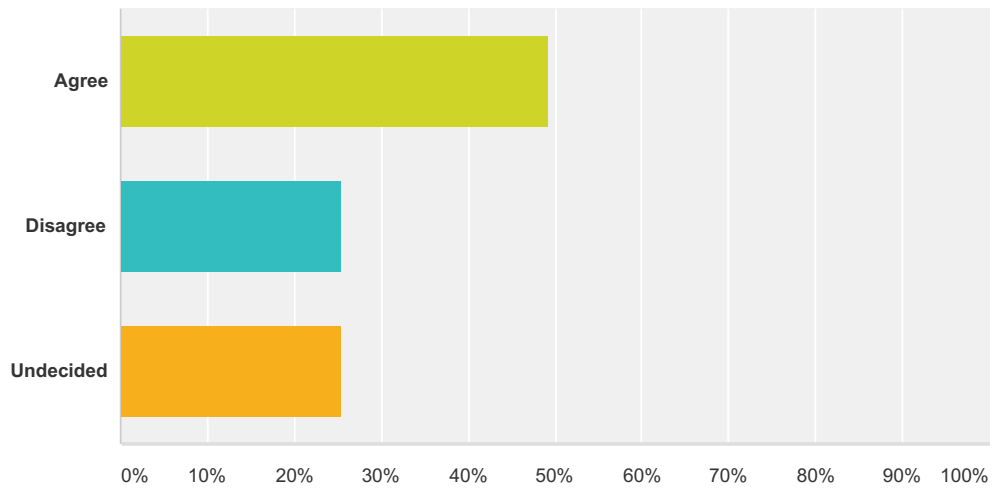

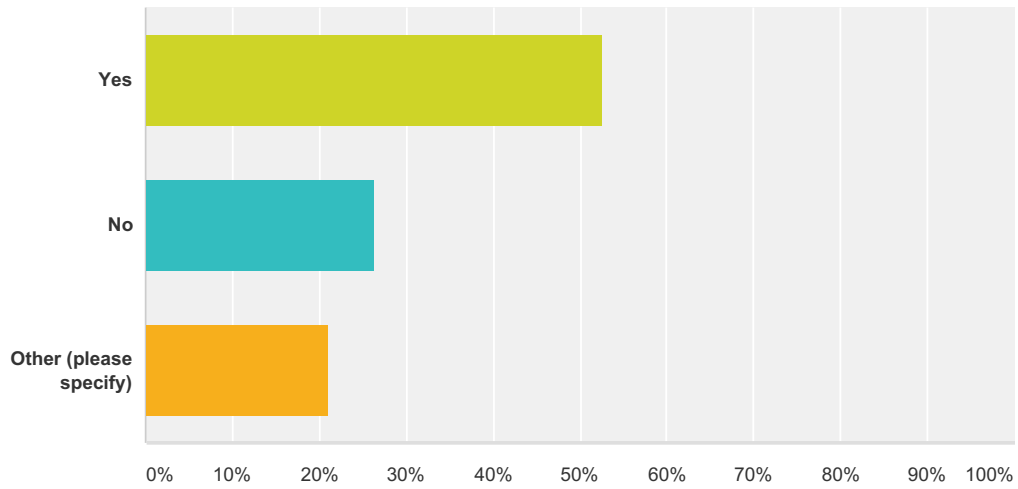

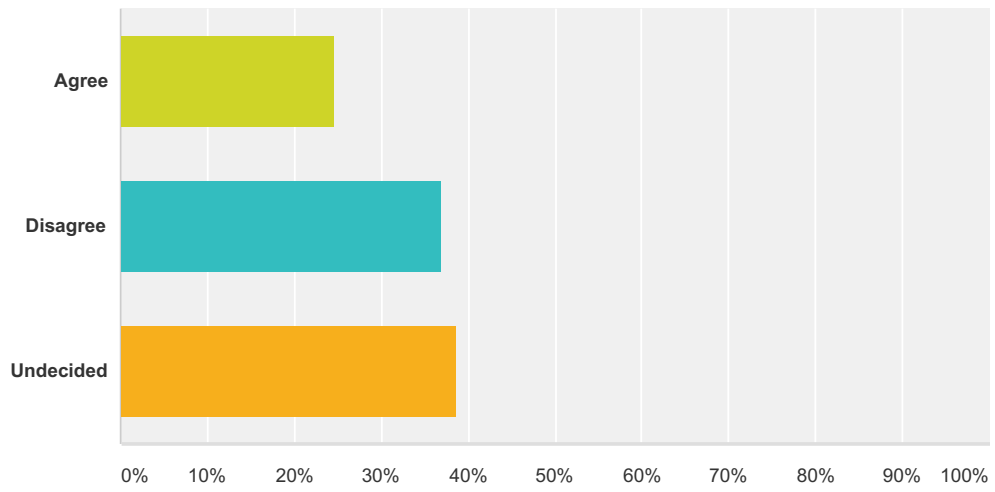

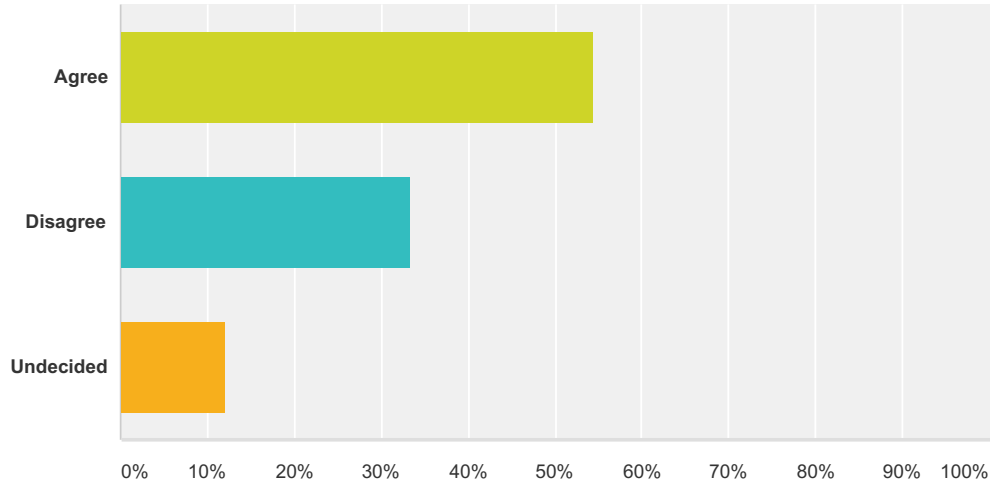

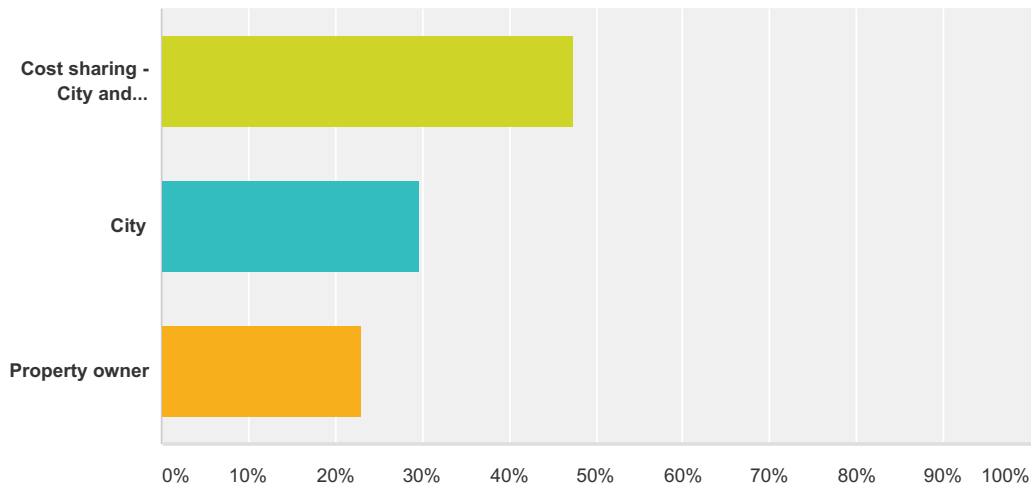

**Q13 If you agree, funding should come from:**

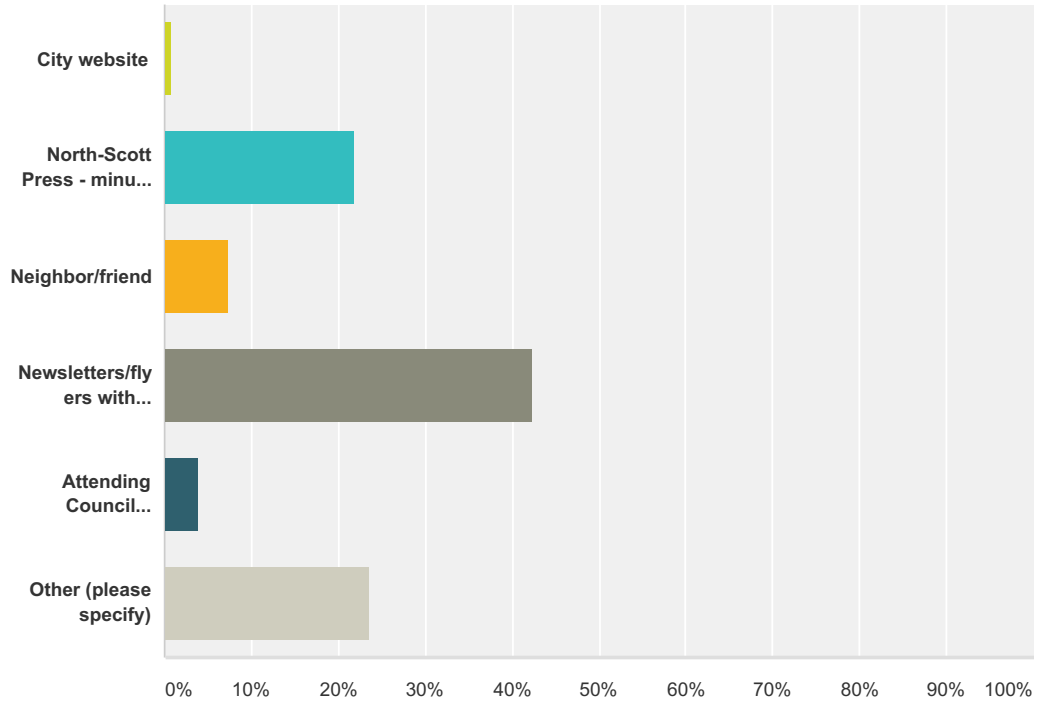

**Q14 How do you currently receive your information concerning the City? Check the one that best describes your choice.**

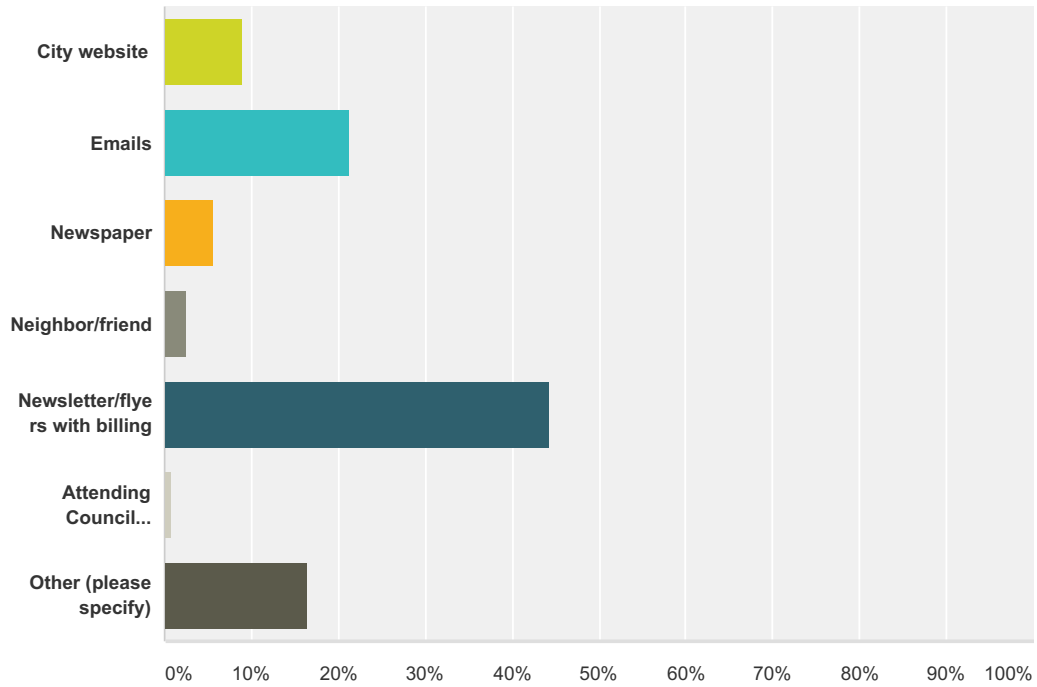

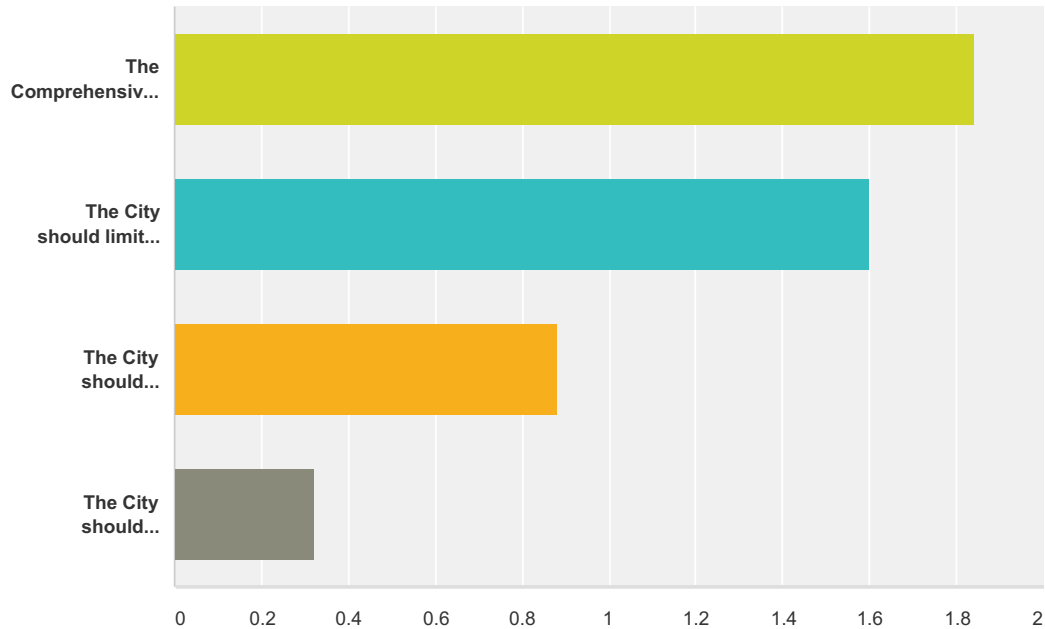

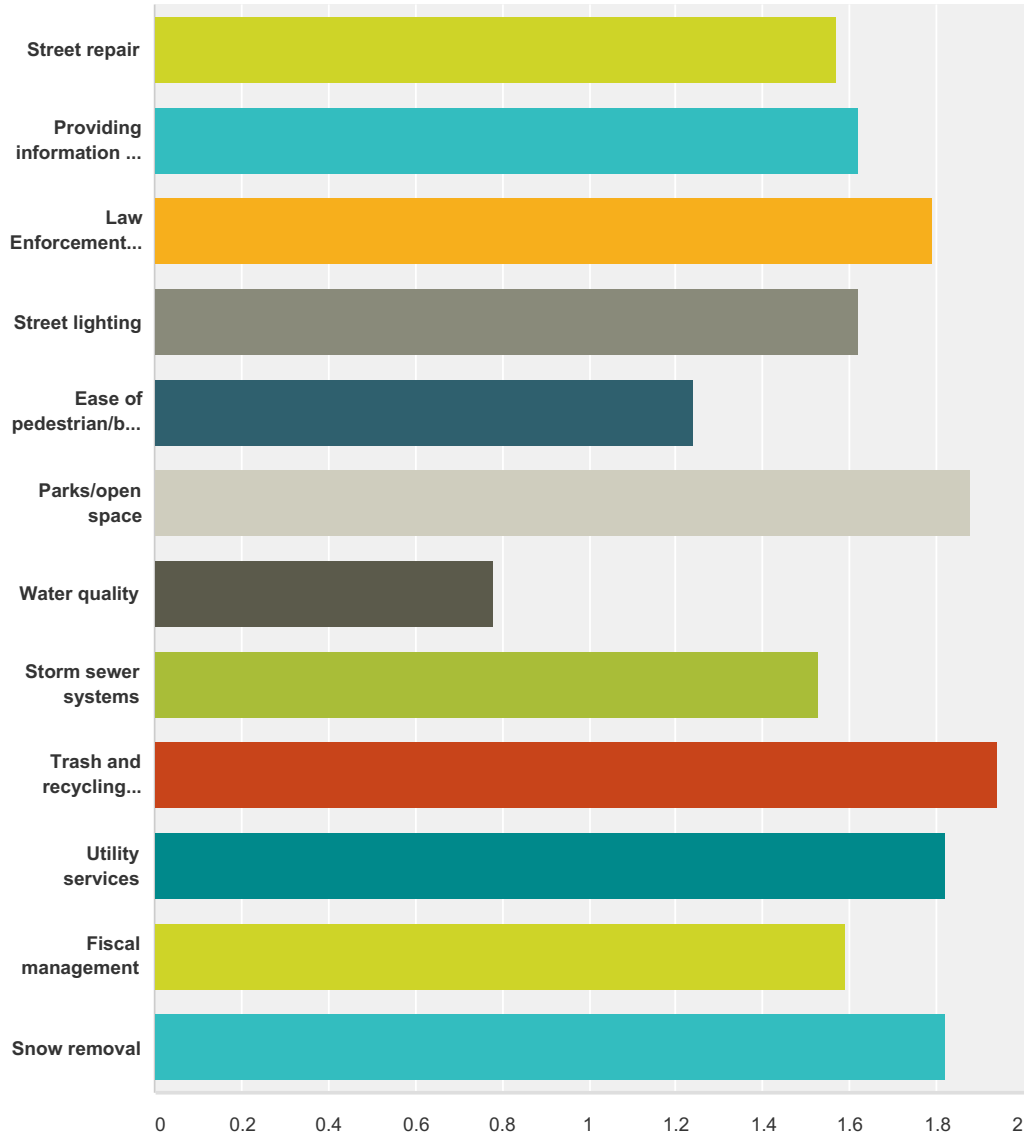
